There is a total of 93 million blood donations worldwide every year. Half of this is donated in developed nations. This means fifty percent of the world's blood supply goes to help just 16 per cent of the world population. The WHO says this is not enough. Another concern for the WHO is that only half of the blood collected in developing countries is checked. Dirty or infected blood leads to many diseases.
